-- EDITORIAL --

Appearing in Richmond News Leader of recent date.

The Y. M. C. A. work in Virginia has deserved well of the people of this commonwealth. Last week a conference that covered three days, at which the State Y. M. C. A. workers from all over Virginia met together, was called at Richmond. The reports on what had actually been accomplished, as well as what is planned, would have given ground for enthusiastic approval under any conditions, and especially was this work commendable following as it did upon the apathy and depression of the post-war period.

With rare courage and undimmed vision, the State Y. M. C. A. has gone steadily about the task of improving inter-racial conditions, and already sixty counties in Virginia have inter-racial committees. It is to be recalled that Virginia is the first State in the South to appoint a secretary for work among the colored men and boys, and the results have been so gratifying it is safe to say that the public approval will not allow the work to lapse.

Even more successful has been the work of the "Y" in the industrial plants. Cotton mills, coal mines, paper mills, iron works and ship building plants have all been touched by the spirit of the "Y", making as it does for better relationships, happier work, better output, higher citizenship. In the opinion of Homer L. Ferguson, the work of the "Y" in industrial plants can no longer be considered a Utopian dream, it has become an industrial necessity.

In the high schools of the State - and there are 340 of them without "Y" work - the "Y" is trying to put in "Hi-Y" Clubs. These clubs have in every instance brought into the school the best spirit for sportsmanship, for study and for life. In the colleges, where the "Y" work was most shot to pieces by the war, a steady effort has been made to regain lost ground, and when the effect of the College "Y" on Christian life is considered, there can be no possible answer to the question as to the absolute need for its support.

Altogether the State Y. M. C. A. suffered perhaps as much as any non-profit earning organization as a result of the war. The "Y" gave all it had to the war, and was itself a war casualty. But before and during the war it developed and demonstrated a public service that entitles it to ask for support from the State as a whole.
