

Mr. Krause spoke on progress of the master plan for the Clifton area, stating that it should be ready by May. In his opinion the sewer work will require about three months.

The mayor and Mr. Krause will see Police Chief Duerr about the shortwave radio for the police car.

The clerk read a letter received from the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors stating that they had ordered preparation of an amendment to the ordinance on firearms to prohibit hunting within one quarter mile of the Town of Clifton.

There was some discussion of the question of whether a paid fireman could serve as a paid policeman of the municipality. The mayor will check this with the Commonwealth Attorney.

Clerk read a letter from the Fairfax Board of Supervisors prohibiting hunting within 1/4 mile of the Town of Clifton.

Mayor read a letter from Mrs. Julia LSutphin requesting approval of repainting her house which was approved by Mr. Krause.

Mr. Krause reported that Chief Duerr would like the mayor and Mr. Krause to meet with him within the next week about the shortwave radio to be used by the Deputy Town Sergeant.

The mayor announced that two deputy town sergeants serving in the Fire Department had resigned after a decision by Fire Executive Burton that county firemen could not work for any other person; also that it wwas voted by the Fire Department that dances would not be continued after 2 May.

The mayor announced that Mr. Buckley and he would not run for reelection, but will be available for any assistance required of them; Mr. Seth Brown will run for the mayoralty. In addition to other incumbents, Raymond Kidwell and Mr. Padour are running for Town Council seats.

Report on sale of 1963 auto tags was read by the mayor. Mrs. Raymond Kidwell is selling 1964 tags through 15 April.

It was moved and seconded that the mayor be authorized to submit recommendations for election judges and messenger, and that if these people cannot be available, he will substitute others. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that Mrs. Hazel McIntyre be recommended for Town Registrar. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that five dollars per month be added to the trash collection fee through the month of August. Motion carried. Town Council elect would have to enter into new contract.

It was moved and seconded that in order to obtain dog licenses residents of the Town of Clifton must comply with the Fairfax County ordinance relative to rabies certification. Motion carried. Clerk was instructed to so inform the court. This has been the regulation in Clifton since 1943w but was not being applied by the county.

It was moved and seconded that the proposed supplemental ordinance on the confining of dogs attached hereto be adopted. Roll call vote showed all members voting ayre.


It was moved and seconded that purchase of space in the Virginia Municipal Review be disapproved. Motion carried.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Mr. Lemarie was introduced and spoke of the current project to change and/or formalize the names of all streets and roads in the northern Virginia area, for the purpose of providing definitive descriptions for fire calls, mail delivery, and so forth, by eliminating duplicate addresses. It is proposed to adopt a uniform county system, retaining historically significant names whenever possible; this will involve change in approximately 85 percent of the house numbers, and giving block numbers to all property in the county. Clifton would be assigned approximately 12,000 to 13,000 on the East/West axis and 7,000 to 8,000 on the North/South axis. The ordinance governing these designation will become effective in April 1965. No duplication of names will occur within any postal area. The proposed name changes in the Clifton area can be held in abeyance if the Town Council wishes to offer alternate choices; within the corporation itself the changes can be made by the town to conform with the master plan. Any changes which the Town Council wishes to have held in abeyance should be sent to Mr. Lemarie by tomorrow in order to be placed before the Board of Supervisors on Wednesday.

It was decided that outside the town limits only ~~xxx~~ changes would be requested - proposed Harris Street from Town of Clifton to Ox Road be changed to Chapel Road; name of Clifton Road from Town of Clifton to 645 be extended to George's Store at junction of 645 and 29-211. Mr. Krause will take this information to Mr. Lemarie.

Within the town limits, the following changes will be considered later:

North Railroad Street to be changed to either Richards or Edwards Street, *Church*
South Railroad Street to be changed to Ford Street
Pope's Head Road to Pope's Head Drive
Pendleton Avenue to Clifton Road
Water Street to School Street
Clifton Road (from Dell Avenue to corporation line) to Main Street




