Our town is on the threshold of a great  
opportunity.

For a quarter-century, Clifton has been  
in a decline, many of its citizens moving out,  
its stores closing, its buildings decaying.  
Nobody seemed to care, or even notice.

Now, powerful, irresistible forces are  
moving down on us. These same forces have  
already transformed the peaceful Fairfax  
County countryside into one of the nation's  
fastest growing suburban communities. Nothing  
on earth can stop that transformation so long  
as the nation's population continues to multi-  
ply and multiply and multiply.

Clifton's opportunity lies not in trying  
to stop the changes that already are around  
us. Our chance lies in understanding, and  
preparing, and guiding this change so that  
our good people can enjoy it and profit from  
it.

We can prepare for the changes if we  
face up to the facts, understand our own  
strength and work together in cooperation  
to make the fullest use possible of our many  
assets.

Clifton does have many assets. Some of  
us take them so much for granted that we may  
not realize their value. Our inventory shows:

1. A town of friendly people, including  
not only the 230 citizens of the town itself,  
but scores of families with Clifton's postal

address, who vote in the Clifton precinct, attend our churches, buy at our store and are protected by the Clifton Fire Department.

2. The natural beauty of the Clifton valley, Popes Head Creek and the surrounding hills and fields which provide Clifton with as fine a natural setting as any community in our part of the world.

3. The Victorian architecture of so many of our houses and the unusual fact that so many of them were built in the same era.

4. The history of Clifton that has many famous roots in America's history, not the least of which is our railroad.

Of all the assets of Clifton, the greatest is our people and it is to them that this report by your Town Council is addressed.

Months ago, members of your Council approached the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors for technical assistance in meeting the economic and health problems that faced the community. We sought sound ideas that would help Clifton develop to the advantage of its own people.

One result was the study developed by the County Planning Staff on how Clifton could exploit its past assets for its future profit. We believe that the plan is basically useful. We intend to borrow from it, changing some parts of it and discarding others as we find best suits the people of Clifton.

The Clifton plan was never intended to serve as a finished blueprint. Instead it is a starting point to set our people to thinking, an effort to rekindle our pride and our hope for Clifton after these long years of decline.

No home in Clifton will be changed because we have a plan. No home will be condemned as a result of the plan. For example, the plan suggests that town houses would be practical in some areas within the town limits. These town houses can only be built if and when the owners do it.

Changes will take place only as property is placed on the market voluntarily and sold to someone who wants to build or restore them. There is a Zoning Commission, as provided by State laws, made up of five residents of Clifton who will prepare new zoning regulations.

Those who prefer to restore houses as they originally existed will be encouraged to do so. We have a Restoration Committee to help preserve the Victorian style of our architecture because that style is one of the town's most valuable assets.

Whatever you may have heard to the contrary, there is no requirement for building town houses. It is only a suggestion to permit increased population within the town limits, provided it meets zoning requirements.

Underlying all this vision of Clifton's future, of course, is the new sewer which the County is scheduled to commence next spring. The sewer will be financed by the county in an effort to remove the complaints about Clifton's 19th Century plumbing fixtures that stand behind so many of our homes.

Your Council is convinced that the sewer system represents the greatest forward step for Clifton since the town was incorporated some 60 years ago.

By conservative estimates, it will add at least a quarter of a million dollars to the value of real estate in Clifton.

In years to come, the sewer will pay for itself many times over in increased property values, better health and increased business. As most of us know, land underlying a large part of Clifton is not suitable for septic fields.

A small sewage treatment plant will be located on the town park area. It will be out of sight and will not give offense to anyone.

The charge for the county sewer will be the same in Clifton as elsewhere in the county.

There will be an availability charge of \$100 against each property. In addition, each owner will pay \$4 per front foot on his property except that the maximum frontage charge on any property will be \$400. Thus the maximum charge by the county will be \$500. Properties with less than 100-foot frontage will pay the county proportionately less.

Plumbing charges for hooking into the sewer are subject to your own plumber's prices from the house to the sewer line.

The regular county charge for use of the sewer is \$9.75 per quarter.

There is no other charge of any kind attached to the installation, connection or use of the sewer.

Any resident of Clifton who wants a long-term loan to pay for the sewer hook-up should inquire at the bank about low-interest FHA loans that are available for this purpose.

Your Council is convinced that the sewer will mark the beginning of a great new chapter in the history of Clifton. It will be a great asset to the town, a creator of new wealth for the property owners and a needed protector of the health of all our citizens. It will mark the end of this period of decay, the beginning of a new period of progress for Clifton.

We ask your support and cooperation in this effort to make the most of Clifton's new opportunity.

Your Town Council is pledged to do everything within its power to move with consideration and sympathy for the individual and personal problems of everyone concerned, and to do this the best way will be to bring your problems to any member of the Council who will be glad to discuss it with you.

Your suggestions as to this matter will be appreciated.



- ROW 5- Ch 4. Skip next single crochet. Double croc in next single croc. (This forms a space.) Ch 1 double crochet in next single croc. Repeat all around. Join to 3rd st in ch 4 (25 spaces)
- ROW 6- Ch 4 (double in next double croc.) Ch 1. Double crochet in next double croc. Repeat all around. Join to 3rd st in ch 4  
Ch 4
- ROW 7-8-9-10-11- Repeat Row 6.
- ROW 12- Repeat for beginning next 2 rows as in Row 2. (1 double crochet in next space. 1 double crochet in next double all around.) Join to top of ch 3.
- Row 13- Ch 3 in top of first double croc. 1 double croc in same st. 1 double in next double. 2 double in next double. Repeat all around. Join. Ch 1 (75 sts)
- ROW 14- 1 single crochet in each double crochet all around. Break off. Tie ribbon around hat with large bow in back of hat. Run through one mesh ~~XX~~ in front and 2 in back of hat for a firm bow. Insert stem of rose through center front of 5th row of mesh and run it through next row in stair step fashion ending on under side of ~~XX~~ bottom with a weaving effect so as not to show from the outside.

This is in regard to your request for an opinion regarding the eligibility of Howard Calvin Elyett to serve an interim term to September 1, 1966, as a member of the Town Council of Clifton.

It is my understanding that Mr. Elyett did not pay his 1964 poll taxes until August 6, 1965, and that on or about August 3, 1965, he was appointed to serve an unexpired term as a member of the Town of Clifton Council. As you know, the charter for the Town of Clifton was amended by Chapter 250 of the 1964 ACTS OF THE ASSEMBLY on March 31, 1964, so that the members of the town council as well as the mayor "shall be residents and qualified voters in said town and whose qualifications to hold office, respectively, shall be the same as required of persons to vote and hold office under the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia." Further, Section "O" of paragraph 1, states that "A vacancy in the office of mayor or councilman shall be filled within thirty days, from the electors of the town, for the unexpired term, by a majority vote of the remaining members of the council, provided, however, that a vacancy in the office of mayor may be filled from their own body by the council." Section 18 of the Constitution of Virginia states that among other things, in order to be qualified as a voter a person must have paid his poll taxes as required by Section 21 at least 6 months prior to the election in which he wishes to vote, and that Section 32 of the Constitution provided that those persons qualified to vote shall be eligible to be any officer of the State or in any County, City, town, or other subdivision of the State....





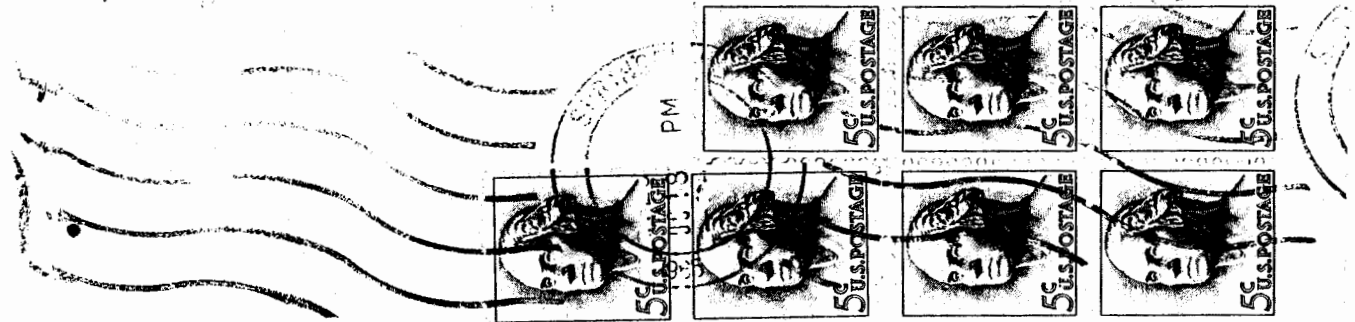
