After some discussion, it was decided that the Council would prefer to move the building in one piece. and Mr. Carusillo agreed to contribute up to \$100 for this purpose; if the Euhler property were available it was proposed to roller it over the side track. However, due to the excessive weight of the building, there was great doubt as to whether this could be done during the present rainy spell. It was therefore decided that Mr. Helsley should inform the RR superintendent that the building would be moved from the right-of-way by 12 March. In event the building could not be moved, arrangements were made for the Town of Clifton and Mr. Helsley to furnish labor, volunteer, to demolish the structure the weekend of 5 March. It was moved and seconded that the building be town down by 5 March if it could not be moved. Motion carried.



SUGGESTED ZORING RESTRICTIONS FOR RECOMMENDATION TO TOWN COUNCIL OF CLIFTON

Residential Districts shall be limited to:

1. Single family dwellings

2. Churches, parsonages, community buildings and parks

3. Professional offices in owner-occupied residential premises

4. Private garages

Building in such districts shall be regulated as follows:

1. Lots should be a minimum of 10,000 sq. ft.

2. Set-back of 45 feet from centerline of abutting streets and not less than 10 ft from adjoining property lines on either side, and not less than 25 ft from adjoining property in the rear of lot.

General Business Districts (with use permit through the Tewn Gouncil) shall be limited to:

"Anyone found guilty of violating this ordinance shall be fined not more than \$100 (one hundred dollars) or imprisoned for not more than 30 (thirty) days, or both."

Mr. Schumann conducted the discussion of the proposed ordinance, giving his suggestions. The work of the Zoning Commission as constituted is now completed, and the body may be dissolved. The same members, if desired, may be requested as a Board of Zoning Appeals as required by law; such a body, however, would require five members. In order to fulfill the law's requirements it is also necessary to have some constituted department for inspection and permit function. Code must be advertized 14 days and public hearing held thereafter; code may them be adopted as law by vote of the Council. Mr. Schumann recommended that action be taken to establish the above bodies; that action be taken to pick up control of water rights and drainage of all natural or storm water in connection with the issuance of any building or use permits; that Newman Road be zoned residential on the south side, with the balance of the property between there and the railroad to be zoned "agricultural"; and that trailer park prohibition be specifically comered.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was decided to consider amendment of the zoning regulations at the next regular meeting of the Town Council, and the meeting stood adjourned at 9:15 pm.
