The following proposed amendment to the Motor Vehicle License Ordinance of 4 March 1958 was read and adopted by unanimous voice vote of the members present:

"Section 5. On each and every motor vehicle to which this ordinance is applicable, including but not necessarily limited to automobiles, trucks and motorcycles, there shall be a tax of ten dollars (\$10.00) per annum....."

It was moved and seconded that effective 1 January 1959 the treasurer be paid fifteen dollars each quarter. Motion carried by unanimous vote of members present.

It was moved and seconded that effective 1 January 1959 William J. Barry be paid five dollars each month as Deputy Town Sergeant. Motion carried by unanimous vote of members present.

It was moved and seconded that the bill from Mr. ^{nk} Bawchenbusch, auditor in the amount of \$20.00 for auditing treasurer's books (\$10 for each of two years) be reimbursed to Mr. Gunther. Motion carried by unanimous vote of members present.


The attached treasurer's report was read and approved.



A special meeting of the Town Council of Clifton, Virginia was convened by the mayor at 8 pm with the following members and visitors present:

W. Swen Elgin, Mayor

Mrs. Lorena R. Selby, councilwoman

Messrs. Brown, Gilman and Millen of the Committee on Town and County Cooperation, and Mrs. Newfield, their recording secretary

Mr. Brown opened the discussion with a brief statement that the business of the present committee was to hear the ideas of others on the subject of the urban county plan and other possible methods of reorganization. He introduced Mr. Gilman, who explained that the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors had set up their parent committee. He read its purpose from the resolution passed by the Board setting up the Commission on Urban County Government, to (1) make a review of proposals therefor, (2) make a report and recommendations to the Board of Supervisors, and (3) represent the county in this field of study. There are 28 members on the Commission, 7 of whom are members of the Board of Supervisors. Committees have been formed as follows: study committee on incorporating the county as a first-class city; legal committee; study committee on county municipal corporation; committee on town and county cooperation.

The following questions were posed for discussion: (1) What are your comments on the Larson Plan (specifically, that towns be authorized to dissolve if desired, and that towns would not be permitted to annex any more land)? (2) Do you have any comment on incorporation of the county as a first-class city? (3) What can be done to solve our growth problems?

After some discussion, ^{3 of the} the members speaking individually expressed their ~~unanimous~~ feeling that it would be preferable to attempt to block further loss of territory through the urban county type of organization with prohibition of further internal annexation - thus leaving the towns as at present and combating peripheral annexation through greater community of interest in small county districts - rather than through incorporation as a first class city, with consequent loss of town organizations and cessation of road funds from the State. *One was in favor of city incorporation.*

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it stood adjourned at 9 pm.

The mayor reported that the State Highway Department has agreed to begin work on clearing ditches shortly.

Treasurer's report as attached hereto was approved as read.

Mr. Barry wished to inquire when new uniforms were expected; the mayor reported that there had been some delay due to the fact that they had not yet been released by the capitol property officer, but they had been secured and would be delivered as soon as possible.

Mr. Gunther introduced the question of the propriety of allowing the construction of a proposed poolroom on the lot across from the Firehouse. The mayor presented a certification from the Chairman of the Zoning Commission that the lot in question is zoned General Business; he further stated that on the basis of the zoning and the clearance of the permit by Mr. Longerbeam he (the mayor) had told Mr. Millen that it was all right to go ahead with his plans for a recreation center. The mayor asked for individual expressions of opinion from the members of the council.

Mr. Gunther stated that he was opposed to the proposal and had circulated a request for replies on the question "Do you favor establishment of a pool hall in Clifton?" He asked that a tabulation of the replies received be entered in the minutes. There was some discussion as to whether these requests had been sent to families outside of the Town, developing the facts that at least 4 ~~handwritten~~ ^{handwritten} replies from people outside, and 1 from a minor. Approximately 109 letters were sent in all.

He asked that the permission to establish the proposed business be refused on the basis that it was degrading to the community.

Mr. Barry stated that he felt there was no question of the legal rights involved, but that at this time an amendment should be made to the zoning ordinance so that use should be restricted. (It was pointed out that this was already the case, and the ordinance was read in its entirety.)

Mr. Gunther stated that he objected very much to a private pool hall, although he would approve a similar installation in the Firehouse, his objection being based on the fact that it was a place for breeding many things and a place to "hang out."

Mr. Gunther requested that Mr. Millen withdraw his petition for a use permit.

Mr. Millen stated that he was not withdrawing his application and had consulted legal advice and found no arguments against the business. His recreation room s will be run by Mr. Shifflett, who is a church member and who intends that it shall be run properly with no drinking or drunks allowed and no boys under 16 allowed inside. He has already secured his state license to operate and following talks with Mr. Longerbeam and the mayor has arranged for the necessary construction work to enlarge the building now situated on the lot in question.

Mr. Harry Selby stated that he believed the Town Council had no basis for objection to a business considered legal by the State, County and other Townships, and that it would provide badly needed entertainment.

Mr. Barry stated that he did not care to become embroiled in such an argument and tendered his undated resignation from the Town Council, feeling that the meeting was a disgrace.

Mrs. Sweeny stated that she felt that the matter should be referred to the Board of Zoning Appeals as provided in the ordinance.

Mr. Gunther asked that Mr. Millen defer his application for thirty days and ascertain the feelings of the people in Clifton.

It was moved and seconded that the resignation of Mr. Buckley be returned unaccepted. Motion carried.

It was moved that Mr Millen's application for a use permit be made through the Board of Zoning Appeals of the Town Council. There was no second and the motion was withdrawn.

Mr. Millen explained that he had obtained a state license and consulted Mr. Longerbeam about building restrictions, and then applied to the mayor for permission to go ahead. He stated that he intended to comply with every regulation of Fairfax County on building and sanitation. His recreation center will be operated on week days from approximately 5 pm to 11 pm, on Saturday keeping open until about 12 midnight, in good weather, and probably from 1 to 2 pm only in bad weather.

Mrs. Selby moved that the Town Council accept Mr. Millen's application for a use permit to start a recreation center on his property. Motion was seconded by Mrs. Sweeny, who stated that she would like her reasons for doing so to appear in the record. She did not feel that the procedures of the ordinance should have been contraverted, but since the center was to operate as a public place subject to regular police surveillance, it was better as a gathering place than a private and unregulated undertaking.

Mr. Millen stated that he hoped that Mr. Barry and the other policemen would feel free to watch the operation of the center, and that if everything was not on a high level he would be the first to suggest that it be terminated.





"Section 1. Be it ordained this 8th day of September 1959 by the Town Council of Clifton, Virginia, that if a person on a Sunday be found selling beer or wine, or shall employ servants to sell beer or wine on a Sunday, he shall be fined not less than five dollars (\$5.00) for each such offense. Each day any person or servant is so employed shall constitute a distinct offense.


"Section 2. This ordinance shall not apply to sales between the hours of two and ten p.m. for consumption off the premises.

"WHEREAS it has come to the attention of the Town Council of the Town of Clifton, Virginia that the President of the University of Virginia has requested funds for early construction of the Northern Virginia Branch of that University in Fairfax, Virginia;

"AND WHEREAS this Council feels that the establishment of State facilities for higher education is urgently needed and in great demand in the northern section of the State of Virginia, and that they will be of inestimable value to the future of its people, both in the northern section and in the State of Virginia as a whole;

"BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that this Council respectfully urges that the appropriation request of the President of the University of Virginia be favorably acted upon by the Governor's Budget Advisory Board, the Governor and the General Assembly of the State of Virginia."

Motion carried unanimously.

The mayor reported that following several cases of ~~Infantile Paralysis~~ ^{Measles} recently the Health Officer of Fairfax County had taken care of the inspection and condemnation procedure in accordance with the current law. Notices were read which had been sent to the owners of the hotel and to Mr. E. 
